Following post-doctoral work with Richard Elliott at the Universities of Glasgow and St. Andrews in Scotland, Dr Kohl moved to the University of Edinburgh on a Wellcome Trust-supported fellowship to start his group in 2006. He also joined the Roslin Institute as Career Track Fellow and on 2011 moved back to the University as MRC Programme leader at the newly formed MRC-University of Glasgow Centre for Virus Research. Dr Kohl's main interest is arbovirus-vector interactions but he also has projects on host responses in vertebrate cells and recently more field-orientated work.
