#### **SUMMARY OF POSITION**

Improving Health Outcomes in the Tropical North: A multidisciplinary collaboration (Hot North) was awarded to Menzies School of Health Research by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) under the Northern Australia Tropical Disease Collaborative Research Programme. This collaboration with other key research institutes across Australia (Telethon Kids Institute, James Cook University, Doherty Institute, Marie Bashir Institute, Burnet Institute, South Australian Health and Medical Research Institute, QIMR Berghofer) aims to strengthen partnerships to undertake research into the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of tropical diseases and Indigenous health disadvantage. The program is centered on five research themes: skin health, respiratory health, antimicrobial resistance, chronic diseases, and vector borne and emerging diseases. The collaboration will facilitate the translation of research findings into positive health outcomes in Northern Australia and the region, with a focus on health policy and practice. A strong component of the collaboration is to build new research capability and capacity in the health and medical workforce. In order to do this, the program will provide salary and project support to early career researchers working on projects of priority to the North. Hot North is inviting applications from early career researchers with specialist skills wanting to contribute to established research programs within the five research themes under the guidance of cross-institutional senior research fellows, CIs and AIs on Hot North. Hot North Fellows will generally be expected to be located fully, or at least half of the year, in Northern Australia. Successful applicants will be awarded salary support for 12 months from January 2017 or on commencement. Hot North Fellows will be expected to be competitive and submit an application for personal support funding such as NHMRC ECF in the year of the fellowship, for funding to commence the following year.
